Launch of the public consultation on the Orientations towards the first Strategic Plan

As per request of the European Commission, we are pleased to announce the launch of the **public** consultation on the Orientations towards the first Strategic Plan implementing Horizon Europe, the next EU R&I Framework Programme. This consultation focuses in particular on the pillar "Global Challenges and European Industrial Competitiveness" and its six thematic clusters.

The inputs received via the consultation will inform the work to prepare a "Strategic Plan" for the first four years of Horizon Europe (2021-2024), which will then guide the related work programmes and calls for proposals. Overall, the consultation will help identify impacts, spark debate and new ideas.

The outcome of this consultation will initially contribute to set the scene of the **European Research** and Innovation Days, taking place in **Brussels** from 24 to 26 September 2019.

Latin American Risk Assessment Symposium -27.-29.08.2019, Montevideo

We would like to inform you that from 27 to 29 August 2019 the Latin American Risk Assessment Symposium (LARAS) "Building-up a regional approach" will take place in Montevideo, Uruguay.

The symposium is jointly organized by the Uruguayan Ministry of Livestock, Agriculture and Fisheries (MGAP) and the German Federal Institute for Risk Assessment (BfR) with the support of the Inter-American Institute for Cooperation on Agriculture (IICA), the Pan American Health Organisation (PAHO), the European Food Safety Authority (EFSA), the Portuguese Economic and Food Safety Authority (ASAE) and the Spanish Agency for Food Safety and Nutrition (AESAN).

The event includes two workshops and it aims at:

- Contributing to the developing food safety structures in Latin America in order to sustainably improve the risk analysis in the region;
- Providing a forum for networking between important food safety actors/ experts/ colleagues;
- Exchanging the state-of-the-art science know-how as well as
- Highlighting the importance of food safety in an interconnected, interdependent world.

Course "Risk-Benefit Assessment in Foods: methods for quantifying health effects" 5 – 14 November 2019

The Risk Benefit research group at DTU Food will organise their highly successful course "Risk-Benefit Assessment in Foods: methods for quantifying health effects" 5 – 14 November 2019, at Lyngby campus in Denmark.

The full time eight day PhD-course has a multidisciplinary focus, including nutrition, toxicology and microbiology, and will learn the participants how the combined health risks and benefits associated to food intake can be assessed and quantified.

Eurobarometer 91.3: Report on food safety in the EU

EFSA published "Eurobarometer 91.3: Report on food safety in the EU" on the occasion of the first World Food Safety Day.

The last Eurobarometer we carried out was in 2010 so this survey marks an important and long-awaited update in our understanding of consumer perceptions around food safety. The findings will no doubt play an invaluable role in informing our social science activities and risk communications going forward.

As with any survey of this breadth - **sampling in all 28 MS with approx. 28,000 respondents**- the findings are multi-layered and dense. The "Key findings" in the report gives you an at-a-glance view. The plan in the months ahead is to carry out more in-depth analysis of the results, most likely with input from external social scientists as well.
