Prior-information notices (PIN) for the open Call to develop roadmap for actions on two SPIDO scientific themes (Risk communication & Animal Welfare)

We would like to inform you about the publication in the Official Journal of the EU (TED) of two priorinformation notices (PIN) for the Open Call (procurement):

• roadmaps for Actions on Evidence-based Risk Communication in the EU Food Safety System (Ref: OC/EFSA/ED/2022/01);

<u>Aim</u>: develop a roadmap for action on evidence-based risk communication in the EU food safety system by providing recommendations for research priorities to support the implementation of risk communication according to the principles defined in the Transparency Regulation;

• development of Roadmaps for Actions on More Welfare: New Risk Assessment Methodologies and Harmonised Animal Welfare Data in the EU (Ref: OC/EFSA/ED/2022/02)

<u>Aim</u>: develop a roadmap for action in the area of risk assessment of animal welfare and to define a multi-annual strategy for its implementation.

The estimated total value for <u>each</u> roadmap is **0.5 Mio EUR.**

Public Consultation SC Guidance on BMD - Deadline 11 April 2022

We inform you that the EFSA's Scientific Committee has launched an open consultation on its <u>draft</u> <u>Guidance on the use of the Benchmark Dose approach in risk assessment</u>.

The consultation will remain open for 7 weeks, until Monday, 11 April 2022.

Here some information on the scope of the consultation:

EFSA's Scientific Committee has launched an open consultation on its draft Guidance on the use of the Benchmark Dose approach in risk assessment. The Guidance was initially published in 2009 and updated in 2017. The purpose of this new update is to align it with internationally agreed concepts described in the recently revised Chapter 5 on dose-response assessment of WHO/IPCS Environmental Health Criteria 240 (WHO, 2020), and therefore harmonise further EFSA's approach with those of its international Partners. The major change compared to the previous Guidance (EFSA Scientific Committee, 2017) concerns Section 2.5, in which a change from the frequentist to the Bayesian model averaging paradigm is recommended for BMD analysis and as a consequence Section 2.6 is now added guiding the reader step-by-step to perform Bayesian model averaging BMD estimation. This public consultation, also targeted to EU Member States Competent Authorities, EFSA's sister agencies, and other international partners, aims to broaden the consensus on the approach for BMD analysis and ensure harmonised outcomes of dose-response assessments. All the comments received will be used for the finalisation of the Guidance and a technical report summarising the outcome of the consultation will be published.

EFSA opinion on sugars in diet

We would like to inform your organisation, and you as its contact in 'Nutrition, Dietic products and Novel Food' competence, about the this week published EFSA <u>Scientific opinion on a Tolerable Upper</u> <u>Intake Level for dietary sugars</u>.

However, the scientific evidence did not allow the setting of a tolerable upper intake level for dietary sugars, the original goal of this assessment.

The opinion's rich findings will support national public health authorities in Europe update future advice for their consumers. The fact that EFSA's review was so wide-ranging allowed our scientists to prioritise the data gaps and research needed to set a tolerable upper intake level for dietary sugars in the future.

The opinion is accompanied by a news story "<u>Added and free sugars should be as low as possible</u>", an infographic "<u>Sugar consumption and health problems</u>" and a plain-language summary "<u>a Tolerable</u> <u>Upper Intake Level for dietary sugars</u>".
